



Fees and Charges 2025

Full-Fee Paying International Students

Lake Joondalup Baptist College is a coeducational K-12 College established in 1990. The College is a not-for-profit organisation, which exists to provide an independent education within the context of the Christian faith. The College relies on income from families in the form of fees as well as recurrent funding from the State and Commonwealth Governments. A portion of fees each year is used for capital projects.

Registration fee

For entry into the College, a non-refundable waitlist fee of \$55 per student is paid upon registration. Students entering the College are taken from the registration list in the order in which this deposit is received, with priority to siblings of current or past students.

Tuition fees

Secondary Years 7-12

International Students
A\$29,324 per annum
(two semesters/two study periods)

Primary Years 1-6

International Students
A\$22,830 per annum
(two semesters/two study periods)

Payment of accounts

The tuition fees for a semester (half the annual fee/one study period) are payable in full, at the commencement of each semester. For students entering the College during the year, proportionate fees must be paid prior to commencement.

The annual tuition fee (two semesters) is indexed annually, generally in line with the Average Government Schools Recurrent Costs.

The Board reserves the right to refuse re-entry to a student whose account is outstanding.

Sibling discounts

A reduction in the Tuition Fee of 7.5% is made for second and subsequent children attending the College at the same time.

Subject/Course Levies (Secondary students only)

Subject/Course Levies relate to costs which reflect the consumable costs of each subject/course for which each student is enrolled. Charges are invoiced at the beginning of Term 1. Adjustments for approved subject/ course changes for Y11 and Y12 will be reflected in the family account at the beginning of Term 2 or Term 3, dependant on when the change becomes effective. Subject/ Course Levies are not refundable should a student be withdrawn from the College part way through the school year.

New students will be charged Subject/Course Levies from the term at which they join the College.

All students are required to wear uniforms, with an approximate cost of \$600. Uniforms, books, etc, must be paid for in full at the time of purchase and cannot be placed on the account. Camps and excursions are to be paid in full prior to the event. The College reserves the right, however, to invoice families for minor expenses other than fees, should the need arise.

Enrolment confirmation fee

When the College offers an enrolment place to a student entering the College, an amount of \$500 is required to secure the place. The enrolment confirmation fee is refundable, less AUD\$200 administration fee, if the student fails to take up a place at the College as per the refund policy specified on the *International Student Application for Enrolment* form.

International students

Lake Joondalup Baptist College is registered to accept Full Fee Paying International Students. Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS) Provider Code 01529C

Notice of withdrawal

One full term's notice in writing must be given to the Principal before the withdrawal of a student from the College. In the event of failure to give such notice, 10 weeks' fees are payable in lieu, unless visa related. Please refer to the Application for Enrolment form for full details of the refund policy.

Refund Policy

Lake Joondalup Baptist College has a clear and transparent refund policy – see International Students Handbook. All refunds will be made in Australian dollars.

Health cover levy (OSHC)

Before a place can be confirmed, the health cover levy must be paid for the full period covered by the student's visa. Please arrange direct with Medibank Private.

Insurance

The policy does not cover medical expenses arising from illness, loss of or damage to personal effect and property, or liability incurred by student for property damage, and it is therefore strongly recommended that parents check their health and general insurance policies to ensure adequate cover is in place.

Booklists

Booklists are distributed for returning students, or with an enrolment package for new students. Books and stationery are supplied through local book stores and online ordering is available.

Uniform

All uniform items, except shoes, can be purchased from the College Uniform Shop.
